Call to order

The meeting was called to order at 4:13 p.m. by Chairperson Ms. Georgia Crossman - 1st

Vice President, PTA.

Devotional exercise

This was conducted by JC's Chaplain Canon Allen who opened in prayer. Cannon Allen read

verses from Romans 12 and commended the virtue of living peacefully with others. He went

on to explain that JC's sole purpose was to prepare its College men to be leaders for the work

burning in the fields.

While some persons have a natural tendency to lead more than others, every JC student is

charged with being a leader in whatever situation he finds himself in life. He went on to add

classroom, no learning will take place. Cannon Allen also pointed to JC's School Prayer which

exemplifies Jesus Christ as the perfect man and the end goal for all College men.

Parents and guardians were encouraged to continue JC's 200+ years legacy of producing

leaders. Cannon Allen closed his charge by asking all to join him in reciting the Lord's Prayer.
