GUIDELINES

- 1. The student must obtain an 'Application to drive to school' form from the school's website jamaicacollege.org
- 2. Only students in sixth form will be granted driving permits
- 3. The student driver must return the completed form to the Dean of Discipline with the student's valid driver's licence; the registration, insurance, vehicle fitness must also be provided.
- 4. Parents/Guardians of the student driver must provide consent before the student is allowed to drive to school or utilize their vehicle to travel to and from approved off campus courses for which they are enrolled through Jamaica College and will depart from Jamaica College.
- 5. A 'Student driver registration permit' will be issued to the student upon return of the completed application form and after review and approval of the application.
- 6. Jamaica College reserves the right to deny an applicant a permit to drive unto to the school's campus.
- 7. Student drivers must always visibly display their 'Student driver registration permit' within the vehicle.
- 8. The vehicle must not be used during school hours unless written parental permission and approval given by the Dean of Discipline, Vice Principals or school nurse.
- 9. Students must not go to their vehicle during school hours without obtaining written permission from the Dean of Discipline or Vice Principals.
- 10. Students must refrain from playing loud music while driving or parked on campus
- 11. Student drivers may only use the designated student drivers parking area.
- 12. Use of student vehicles for excursions or out of school events are dependent on the guidelines provided by the teacher(s) organizing the excursion or event. If teachers allow students to take their vehicle on excursions, then written parental permission is required for the student driver and for any passenger.
- 13. Student drivers must inform the Dean of Discipline in writing if the information stated on their application changes.
- 14. Student drivers must adhere to the posted speed limit while driving on the compound and follow the general road laws and rules of the school.
- 15. All cars driven by students are subject to searches from time to time as may be required by the school's safety and security measures.
- 16. Jamaica College reserves the right to deny or revoke a students' permit to drive if the student does not follow these guidelines and all the rules of the school.
- 17. The Parent/Guardian assumes full responsibility for any injuries or damage that may be caused by a student driver in the event of an accident on the school's campus.
- 18. Parents and students are advised that Jamaica College takes no responsibility for damage to any vehicles left on the school's premises and that drivers park on the premises at their own risk.
