Your Earthquake Safety Guide for Jamaica College



Earthquake Protocols for Students and Staff

Before the Earthquake

- Be Familiar with the evacuation routes (see map below)
- participate in earthquake drills
- know the designated safe areas



During the Earthquake

Students will:

- Immediately carry out DROP, COVER, HOLD Procedures by taking cover under desks and tables
- MOVE AWAY from windows.
- Remain in sheltered position for at least 60 seconds
- Be silent and listen to instructions









Teacher will:

- Take Cover
- Talk Calmly to students
- · Review procedure for evacuating classroom

After the Earthquake

- Follow evacuation procedures immediately.
- Proceed to the designated assembly points (the top field) in an orderly manner.
- Report any injuries or damage to a teacher or staff member.

Additional Considerations

If Indoors

- In halls, stairways, or other areas where no cover is available, move to an interior wall. Turn away from windows, kneel alongside the wall, bend head close to knees, cover sides of head with elbows and clasp hands firmly behind the neck.
- If you are in the library, immediately move away from windows and bookshelves and take appropriate cover.
- In laboratories and kitchens, all burners should be extinguished (if possible) before taking cover. Stay clear of hazardous chemicals that may spill.

If outdoors:

- Move to an open space away from buildings and overhead power lines.
- Crouch low to the ground (your legs may not be steady).
 Keep looking around to be aware of dangers that may bring you harm.
- If you are in a motor vehicle (just getting ready to leave for a school excursion), stop the vehicle away from power lines, bridges, overpasses and buildings. Students should remain in their seats and hold on.
- Indoors or outdoors, when an earthquake occurs: TAKE ACTION AT THE FIRST INDICATION OF GROUND SHAKING:



Picking Up Students After an Earthquake

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As part of our commitment to safety, we want to ensure you are aware of the pick up procedure for your child after an earthquake. Below are key guidelines to follow during such an event:

1. Stay Calm and Wait for Instructions

- · Wait for official notification from the school before coming to the premises.
- Do not phone the school, as we may be trying to reach you or emergency services.
- When safe to travel, go to the school to collect your child. Your child will NOT be released otherwise.

2. Follow Designated Pick-Up Procedures

- Check for updates on pick-up locations, as these may change based on the situation.
- Only individuals listed on the emergency contact form can pick up children.

3. Be Patient

- Reuniting children with families takes time to ensure everyone's safety
- Be prepared for potential delays caused by road conditions or other factors.

4. Follow Traffic Guidelines

- Be mindful of emergency vehicles and traffic that may be near the school.
- · Use designated parking areas only.

5. Communicate with the School

- If you cannot reach the school immediately, notify us of your situation as soon as it is safe.
- If you are unable to reach the school, contact a designated guardian to collect your child.
- Ensure your contact information is always up to date.
