Denbigh High Secures Double Victory as Kingston College and Jamaica College Triumph.

The Third round of the Inter-Secondary Schools Sports Association (ISSA) and Jamaica Hockey Federation (JHF) High School Under-19 Hockey Tournament continued with four thrilling matches on Tuesday, February 25, 2025, at the JHF Ground.



In the opening game, Munro
College started strong against
Kingston College, launching a
series of attacking plays that kept
their opponents on high alert.
However, as the match
progressed, Munro College's
intensity waned, allowing Kingston
College to settle into its defensive
structure. Kingston College
capitalized on a lapse in

Munro's defense in the 41st minute, as Dah Sean Gibson found the back of the net to give his team a 1-0 lead. Despite both teams creating scoring opportunities, none were converted, and Kingston College secured their second win of the season with a disciplined performance.

The second match saw Denbigh High Girls asserting their dominance over Merl Grove High with a convincing 2-0 victory. Denbigh entered the match as a favorite,
